## **Summary**

## Zoltán Györgyi– György Mártonfi: The effect of the Leonardo mobility program on the participants

Hungary has been taking part in the Leonardo da Vinci programme since 1997. Since that time our country has been supporting mobility programmes which help secondary school students, undergraduates and young workers with their field practice abroad and also support the foreign studies of the teachers who participate in the professional training.

A general assessment has been made of the first two phases of the programme (1997-1999 and 2000-2002) which, analyzing short-range experiences and effects, make suggestions for the further operation of the programme.

The Tempus Public Foundation, which is in charge of the Leonardo da Vinci programme, commissioned the Educational Research Institute and its successor, The House of Professors Research Institute of Higher Education, to analyze the long-term effects of the mobility programmes and, first of all, their impacts on the career of the participants (grantees).

The results of this commission are published in the following comprehensive study and in the two part-studies that serve as its basis. At the end of the analysis we also draw up our proposals for the further operation of the programme.

The studies are complemented with appendices which contain short casestudies on the basis of the interviews, the tables of the questionnaire survey and the two questionnaires.
